



Extended Project Qualification - EPQ

The **Extended Project Qualification (EPQ)** is challenging and exciting. It gives students the freedom to conduct research, in a subject area of their choice.

Students will **research and plan a dissertation** (a developed essay) and will **present their evaluation** of their own work. The project helps in developing **independent** thinking and **creative learners**.

The skills that students develop through the Extended Project are excellent preparation for university-level study.

Students can refer to the Extended Project in their UCAS personal statements and at interview to demonstrate some of the qualities that universities are looking for.

The Extended Project is an AS Level qualification which will be graded A* to E, and attracts up to 70 UCAS tariff points.



- You will submit the final version of your Extended Project in the form of a Dissertation (*minimum of 5,000 words*).
- You will also give a Presentation on your Extended Project.
- Your ongoing planning and evaluation will also be assessed as part of your AS.
